

The General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM) calls for the faithful to "kneel beginning after the singing or recitation of the Holy, Holy, Holy until after the Amen of the Eucharistic Prayer, except when prevented on occasion by ill health, or for reasons of lack of space, of the large number of people present, or for another reasonable cause. However, those who do not kneel ought to make a profound bow when the Priest genuflects after the Consecration." In other words, if you find yourself standing during the consecration—as you will notice our choir and cantors do—a profound bow when the priest genuflects is in order. If you are kneeling, a head bow when the priest genuflects is not necessary, but certainly okay to do. It's important to note that this bow happens after the body or blood has been elevated so that we can gaze upon it. The purpose of the kneeling or profound bow is reverence—it is not meant to keep us from viewing the sacrament. The elements are elevated in order to be seen, contemplated, and adored.

What's New In ArchLou Podcast—December 2023




